### **Biography for The Reverend Dr. Robert T. Solomon – Guest Revivalist**

The Reverend Dr. Robert T. Solomon, a native of Savannah, Georgia, is the son of the late Jimmy Lee Fennell and the late Edith Solomon. He holds a Bachelor of Science degree from Tuskegee University, and upon graduation, he was commissioned as an officer in the United States Army. He earned a Master of Science degree from Troy University and his doctorate in Business Administration with a concentration in Leadership from Walden University. He also attended the Calvary Bible Institute in Washington, D.C.

Raised in the church, Rev. Solomon knew there was a calling on his life from an early age. In July 2010, Rev. Solomon was licensed and ordained to preach the Gospel under the leadership of Rev. Dr. Thomas E. Williams, Pastor of the First African Baptist Church of East Savannah. Rev. Solomon has served in many roles in the church, including pastor of the Historical First African Baptist Church in Statesboro, Georgia. In 2016, he and his wife became financial supporters of mission work for Haiti. In 2017, Rev. Solomon traveled to Haiti on a mission trip to distribute educational and medical supplies and to spread the Good News of the Gospel.

Reverend Dr. Solomon has worked in post-secondary education in the technical, community, and historically black college settings in various administrative roles. Passionate about helping young people achieve their academic and professional goals, he has written numerous proposals and received funding to establish mentoring programs to equip minority students with the support to achieve academic success while developing leadership skills.

The Reverend Dr. Solomon is an associate minister of the New Lebanon Missionary Baptist Church in Tupelo, Mississippi. He holds life membership in Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity, Incorporated. He is married to the former Linda E. Schlureth of Germany. They are parents of four young adult children and four grandchildren.
